Behind the Masks July 1, 2021

"When morning came, it was Leah!" – Genesis 29:25

Jacob had worked for Laban for seven years with the promise that he could marry Laban's youngest daughter, Rachel, at the end of those seven years. However, on the morning after the wedding, Jacob is beside himself to learn that it was Rachel's older sister, Leah, whom he had actually wed. It had been Leah, behind the veil or mask, and not the woman he expected and loved.

As we begin to remove our masks, our facial coverings, after this long season of covering up and hibernating in attempts to slow the spread of COVID, we may be surprised at how our neighbors look. Maybe it has been so long since you saw your friend or neighbor without the lower half of their face being covered, that you forget what they look like without it! They may have grown a mustache since you last saw them without a mask. I have even read where teeth whitening has increased since restrictions are being lifted!

Some folks may remove their cloth (or paper) face coverings, but their masks will remain, unseen. They hide their pain, their loneliness, their fear behind an overbright smile that doesn't reach their eyes. Their worries are masked behind an impassive expression. Their insecurities and pain may even be hidden behind a grouchy demeanor, or a mean streak.

The truth is — we don't know what other folks are going through, what they are experiencing. We make judgments based on their outward expressions and appearances. Often, we are in such a rush that we don't take the time to truly look at someone, observe their body language. We don't look up from our smart phones and electronic devices and actually listen to what they are saying, never mind listening to what they aren't telling us.

Stop and think for a minute, when you are having a bad day and someone smiles at you, you smile back, grateful for that little bit of cheer. When someone compliments you, that acknowledgement perks you up a little bit. When someone takes the time to ask what is bothering you and listens while you let the mask slip and pour out what you have kept bottled up inside, you feel better, relieved, valued.

Now that the masks are coming off, take some time to "see" one another. Take some time to listen to one another. Take some time to get to know the person behind the mask, you might be surprised at the treasure you find.

Once again, it looks like someone is trying to trick and phish people into thinking that Bishop Park is sending an email asking them to send him gift cards, cash, or some other form of payment. These emails are being sent from a created Gmail (or other) account that may look like it's from the Bishop, or even another pastor, but it is not from their conference @susumc.org account. Please inform all your pastors, and make your church members aware to mark these fraudulent emails as spam and ignore them. We are aware that they are still coming in, but unfortunately there is nothing we can do except to tell people to mark these emails as spam and not reply back.

Honor our Bishop by Building the Beloved Community

pproximately a year ago we were in lock-down, but still thinking we were going to have General and Jurisdictional Conferences as were originally planned. We knew that our Bishop, Bishop Park, was going to retire as of September 1, 2020 and that we would find out who would be taking his place at the Jurisdictional Conference slated in July 2020. However, as the pandemic unfolded, we realized that many of our plans were not going to work out as we thought. Bishop Park was asked to continue on as our Episcopal leader in the interim and graciously agreed. It was recently announced by the Northeastern Jurisdiction College of Bishops that Bishop Park will be moving into voluntary retirement on September 1, 2021 and that Bishops Moore-Koikoi and Steiner Ball will be the presiding Bishops of the Susquehanna Conference, West Virginia Conference, and the Western Pennsylvania Conference.

Now we have the task of trying to say goodbye to a leader that has not only led us for two quadrennia, but also then continued a full year beyond, when he planned to retire, based on the needs of the church. As the Episcopal Leadership Transition team met, they asked themselves "What should our Conference get a retiring Bishop who has done so much for our Conference and has gone above and beyond during these trying times?" As we all know, our Bishop has a heart for other people and a gift that would ultimately end up helping others is what the committee discerned would be best.

As a retirement gift for Bishop Park, all churches and people of the Susquehanna Conference are invited to make a donation in his name to the Building the Beloved Community Fund (BBCF). This fund was created out of the passion and commitment that Bishop Park has for an inclusive church. The Bishop's belief and energy is clearly evident as he has helped our Annual Conference continue to break down the walls of division caused by racism. Our Conference Mission is to grow spiritual transformational leaders, equip vital congregations and create new places for new people, and connect with each other and the world so that alive in Christ together, the Susquehanna Conference will embody the beloved community of disciple making congregations. One hundred percent of the money donated to the BBCF will be used to help us as a conference live into our mission to be the beloved

Fifty percent of the donations to the fund will be overseen by the Commission on the Beloved Community. The commission will disperse much of the money in the form of grants to churches and church entities that propose a specific project toward eradicating racism and enhancing and celebrating diversity. The commission will also use some of the money to fund initiatives on behalf of the



conference as a whole. The other fifty percent of the money collected will be overseen by the Cabinet to fund programs like diversity training, supporting cross-cultural appointments, and promoting diversity.

We know that you and your congregation have a heart for mission and ministry and a commitment to becoming the beloved community God calls us to be.

Please make the check out to the Susquehanna Conference and write "BBCF-9300" in the memo line. Churches can send in money and list it on their remittance report (BBCF-9300). We will announce the gift to Bishop Park at Annual Conference in June and let him know the gifts that have been received up to that point. We can think of no better gift to our Bishop than to promote a fund developed to help us live into those goals; ensuring that our work can and will continue as we strive to shove the love of God to all God's children.
